



Q: What if I'm not sure what school I'm going to attend?

A: In the field that asks that question, you can list more than one college that you've been accepted to. Although it shows up as "Accepted/Attending," filling in the name of a school(s) does not commit you to attending that school! If you are still waiting to hear, choose the option "Applied" and list the school(s) you are hoping to attend.

Q: How long should the essay be?

A: While there is no set length, please keep in mind that we usually have over 100 applications to get through. It's perfectly acceptable to use your college application essay; we want to know what your dreams/goals/ambitions are, and maybe what led you in that direction.

Q: Can the "Unusual Circumstances" question be part of the general essay?

A: It's better to fill out the Unusual Circumstances section separately, with perhaps more detail. Even if it's something you think is insignificant or you've been dealing with much of your life so that it seems routine (such as shuttling between divorced parents, or helping out with a disabled sibling, perhaps), it will only help you to write a few lines about how that has shaped you as a person. ALL APPLICATIONS ARE TREATED WITH THE UTMOST CONFIDENTIALITY!

Q: What GPA should I use?

A: Select "I have High School GPA information only" and fill in your *unweighted* cumulative GPA (on a 4.0 scale).

Every page of the electronic application has an online SUPPORT button which you can click to ask questions or get technical assistance.

And do not forget to "SUBMIT APP" at the end so you can be considered for scholarships!
